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## Policy statement

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Routine circumcision is clinically proven and, therefore, medically necessary for newborns when the following criteria are met:

For newborns covered by AmeriHealth Caritas Louisiana, routine circumcision is covered as a value-added benefit.

All medically necessary circumcisions are a covered benefit for all beneficiaries.
